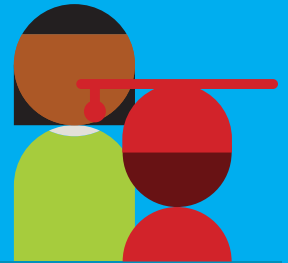


NYC Parents! Know your rights about your child's education during the 2020-21 school year, so you can protect your family if ACS opens an investigation.

This document is for children in NYC Department of Education (DOE) schools. Does your child go to a charter, private, or non-DOE school? Things may be a little different. Tell your school what you need to learn your options!



The DOE is doing "blended learning" this year, a mix of in-person days and remote days learning from home.

You can choose full-time remote learning for your child at any time. Fill out this [form](#) if you want to do only remote learning.

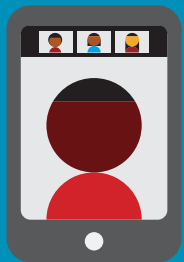
You can switch to blended learning at different points in the school year, starting in November.



You can get a device for remote learning.

Fill out this [form](#) to get a device. If you have more than one child in school, you can get a device for each child!

Your child may have the right to receive special education services.

You can request an evaluation for services at any time by talking to your child's teacher or other school staff. The school should develop a plan for services whether your child is doing remote or blended learning.

You have the right to information about your child and their school.

You may be able to get free child care on the days your child is scheduled for remote learning.

Your child must be in 3K to 8th grade to qualify. To apply for your child, click [here](#).
